RE: Applicability of the Solid Waste Regulations to the Platte Valley Pit/Broda Inert Fill Operations

SW-WLD-PVP 1.1

Mr. Broda,

On July 12, 2017 the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment ("CDPHE") and the Division of Reclamation and Mining Safety ("DRMS") of the Colorado Department of Natural Resources finalized a revised Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") (attached) that defines the regulatory roles each agency plays when solid waste is beneficially used, or disposed of, at mining sites. Page 3 of the MOU states:

"Where the facility is complying with MLRB Permit pre-screening requirements (Rule 3.1.5(9)), inert material may be used as fill during mining without further HMWMD approval in accordance with the pre-approved beneficial use table referenced in the Solid Waste Regulations, 6 C.C.R. 1007-2, Part 1, § 8.6.1(A)(4) (Table 3)."

The Division believes that Broda's Inert Fill ("Broda's"), which is operated at 1859 North HWY 85, in Brighton, Colorado may meet the above conditions and if Broda does, CDPHE may relinquish regulatory oversight to DRMS. Please supply a copy of the DRMS reclamation permit and CDPHE will coordinate with DRMS to determine if Broda's activities fit the conditions above. CDPHE will notify you of our determination following our coordination with DRMS.
