OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Russ Means and Lucas West (DRMS); Ed Cotter, Kyle Turley, Bill Dam, Jim Denier, and Polly Robinson (DOE); Gus Gaviotis and Scott Pottorfs (Cotter Corportation) were present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The JD-6 Mine is located approximately nine miles west of Naturita and accessed from EE19 road. The site is a 110d operation that includes a total of 6.24 permitted acres.

The site is currently in Temporary Cessation. The repaired retaining wall continues to appear stable. Stormwater control structures appeared well maintained and functional.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
