Robins Construction, LLP, P.O. Box 212, Antonio, CO 81120, has filed an application for a Regular (112) Construction Materials Operation Reclamation Permit with the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board under provisions of the Colorado Land Reclamation Act for the Extraction of Construction Materials. The proposed mine is known as the "Robins Consolidated Pit" (formerly known as Valdez Pit), and is located at or near Section 32, Township 33 North, Range 9 East, New Mexico Principal Meridian.

The Proposed date of commencement is November 7, 2017, and the proposed date of completion is December 31, 2038. The proposed future use of the land is Rangeland.
