As a property owner in Southwest Highway 115 area, I object to Transit Mix Concrete Company's (TM's) application M2017-049 to establish a quarry on Hitch Rack Ranch.

They listed two changes. Reduction of the duration of the operation, and reduction of the area of the operation. Do these changes make any difference? Of course not. They cleverly avoided the number one issue. By far the most important issue is damage to the fragile aquifers that supply our already scarce water supply. Will the shock waves of the blasting be diminished? Of course not. It takes a tremendous force to separate hundreds of cubic yards of rock from a canyon wall. Do the shock waves stop at the property line? Of course not. There is more rock sticking out the ground in Colorado than all the rest of the United States. Thousands of square miles of it. There is no need to put a rock quarry in the middle of another residential neighborhood and properties surrounding this site.

Will the reduction mentioned above mitigate the loss of property values? Of course not.
