Ms Eschberger,

I am a resident and property owner in the Southwest Highway 115 area, and I object to Transit Mix Concrete Company's application (M2017-049) for a permit to establish a quarry on Hitch Rack Ranch.

The application makes no provision for protection of the existing wildlife corridor in that area.

This is an area with limited water resources, and the permit application provides no protection for the water supply for the existing residents of the area.

The application completely ignores the fact there is an outstanding legal issue concerning whether Transit Mix has any legal right to access the property using Little Turkey Creek Road. Owners and Residents of the properties above and below the proposed quarry site are the deeded owners of that right of way and road easement.

There is no need for another quarry along Highway 115. The existing quarries in this area are not operating anywhere near capacity, nor are they running out of materials. I urge the Mined Land Reclamation Board to deny Transit Mix's application (M2017-049).

I also request that both the pre-hearing conference and the MLRB hearing be conducted in Colorado Springs.
