Dear Mr. Roys:

On February 9, 2018 the Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety (Division) received information for an "Is It Mining" questionnaire regarding a proposed project to search for gemstones at the above referenced site.

The Mined Land Reclamation Board has requested that the Division make determinations as to the need for a Mined Land Reclamation Permit. <u>Pursuant to the questionnaire and other information the Division has</u> <u>determined that a permit is required</u>. Based on the proposed disturbance of an acre it appears that a hard rock 110(1) permit which is for less than 5 acres will be required. If you have any concerns or disagree with this decision, you may petition to appear before the Board during a formal public hearing for a Declaratory Order concerning this matter. Pursuant Rule 2.5.2 (1): the request must be submitted to the Board <u>in writing</u> and be received no later than 10 days prior to the hearing. The written request must contain the information required pursuant Rule 2.5.2 (2). (Rule 2.5 Enclosed) The next available Board hearing will be held on March 21, 2018. All hearings are held at 1313 Sherman St., Room 318, in Denver, Colorado 80203. Please be advised the Division will oppose a Declaratory Order request for this proposed operation based on the above stated reasons and other facts it may bring forth in testimony before the Board if necessary.
