RE: Mid-Continent LST, File No. M-1982-121 , Notification of Coring Activity

Dear Mr. Dangler:

On January 31, 2018 the Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety (Division) had a phone conversation with Bobby Wagner. During that conversation the Division was made aware of past coring activity. It was explained that this activity was done to test the resource quality and quantity. In total six holes were drilled at varying depths in within the mining permit boundary in early December of 2016. Furthermore the Division requested that Mr. Wagner provide the Division with the specifics of that activity. On February 13, 2018 he Division received this information via email. (Enclosed). All core holes have been backfilled and will likely be mined through as they are located within the processing bench. The Division also produced a simple map to verify the locations of the holes relative to the mining activity.

Coring activity is not approved under the current mining plan. At this time the Division is not citing this as a problem. However if in the future you wish to do additional coring activity it must first be approved in writing by the Division. If the area you wish to test is within your permit boundary, you will need to revise your mining plan to allow that type of activity. This can be done under a technical revision. If you wish to test areas outside of your permit boundary you will need to submit a Notice of Exploration. The Notice of Exploration will be separate from your current permit.

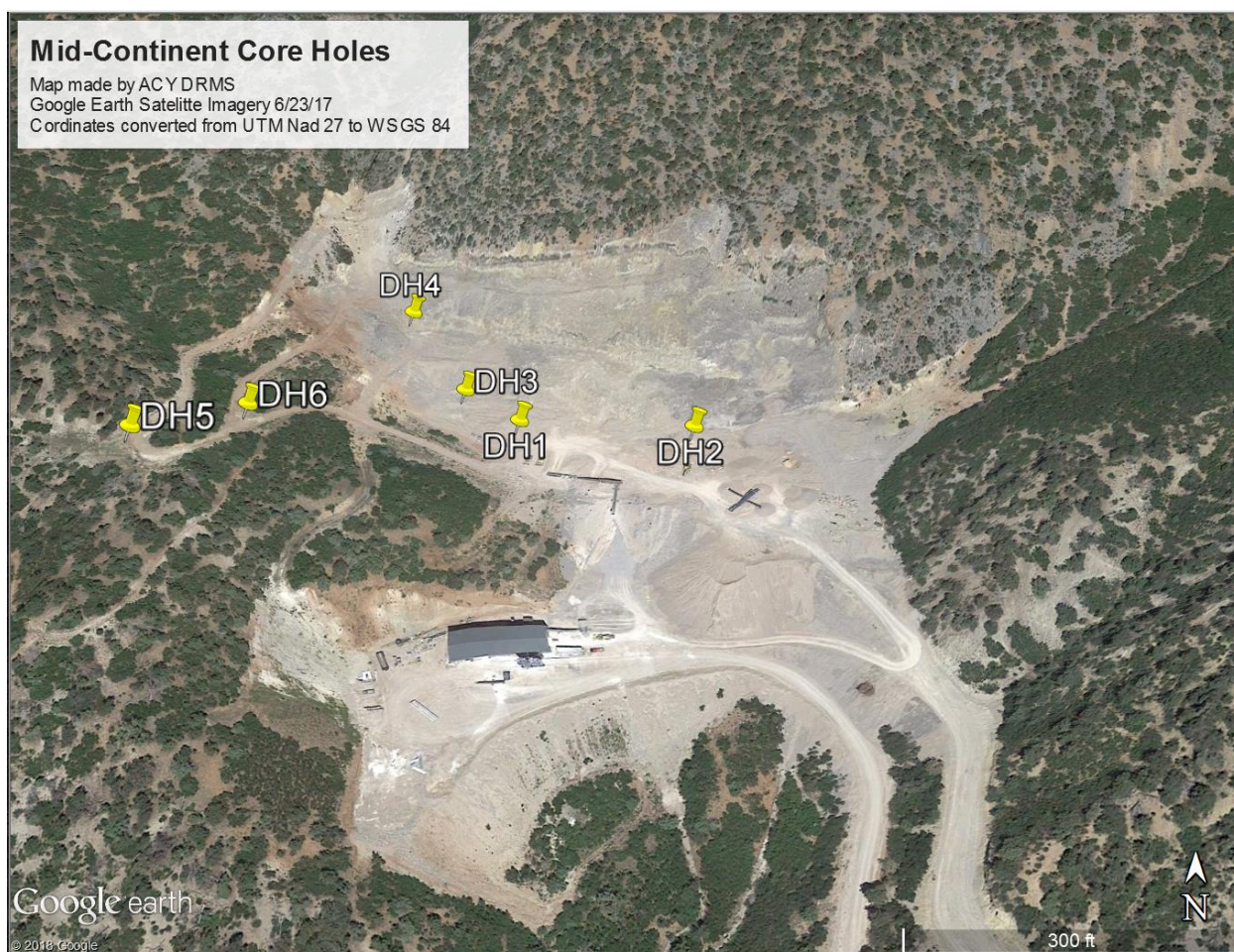

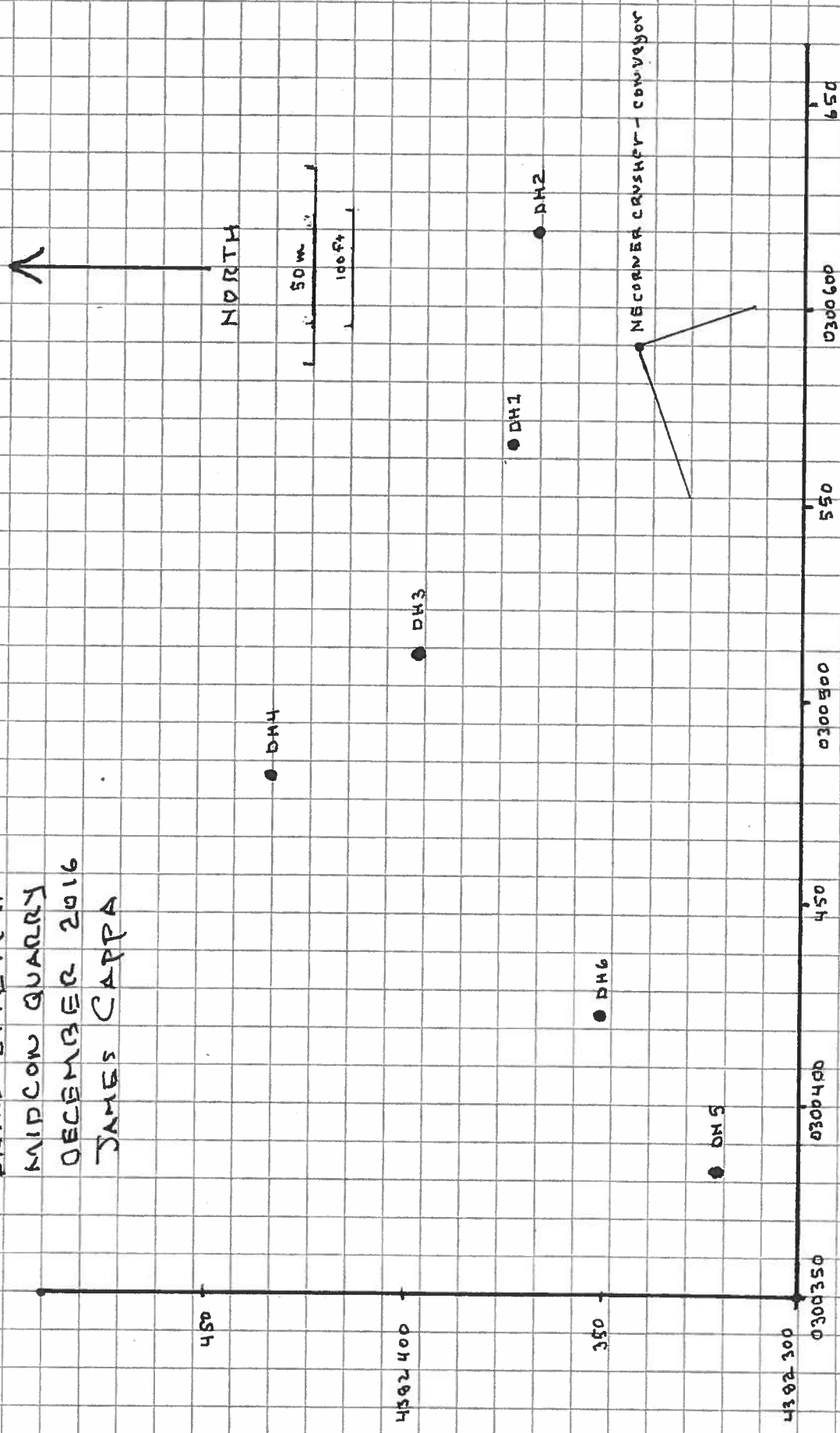
