OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) normal monitoring program. The C Road Pit is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 84.90 permitted acres. The site located at the intersection of C Road and 31 Road in Grand Junction, CO. Greg Monger of Parkerson Construction, Inc. represented the operator and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division conducted the inspection.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. A sign is posted as you enter the permit boundary. The permit boundary is delineated by fences in some areas and t-post in areas adjacent to the 31 Road Pit (M-1987-178).

This site was active at the time of the inspection. This is a newly activated permit. Approximately an acre has been stripped so far in the northwest corner of phase 1. This site has a maximum disturbance of 40 acres. Material was being excavated and loaded to be hauled off site. The near vertical highwall is approximately 20 feet tall and 300 feet long.

For the time being the C Road Pit is using the access road for the 31 Road Pit since that's where the scale is located. Material was weighed prior to it leaving the site. Once mining progresses and 31 Road Pit is mined out the scale will be moved and the more western access road will be used. Both pits are owned and operated by Parkerson Construction, Inc.

No equipment, fuel or structures are located on site. There are no stockpiles or exposed water. No interim or final reclamation has been complete. The topsoil pile did not appear to be reseeded yet. The site is clean and free of trash and other miscellaneous debris.

Since the inspection a Succession of Operators application has been submitted to transfer the pit to Kilgore Companies LLC dba Elam Construction. This inspection will also serve as the SO-1 inspection.

The Division currently requires a financial warranty amount of \$241,201.40 for this site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
