I reviewed the documents and responses of Bowie to your adequacy letter #1.

Bowie must address the reclamation of Farmers Ditch --the original reclamation was silent except for the general promise to restore the land to "it's original contours" and to protect any possible diminishment of water flows. The Farmer's Ditch must be restored to its original configuration--an open ditch with easements for maintenance.

Additionally, the situation of Black Bridge Road can not unilaterally be decided by Bowie--the County owns the road which Bowie caused to be changed to suit their business needs. The County, and the neighboring property owners (especially Lee Bradley) need to agree to what Bowies' revised reclamation proposes.

Last, I want to see both the plan, and the cost for the removal of the 46K volt power line and metering point --neither a plan nor a cost is in the revised RCE.

The second adequacy review letter sent last week does not address the Black Bridge Road or the power line costs.

Please take this as a request for another informal hearing --since the previous one did not address any of our concerns, and the response to your first adequacy letter was not adequate.
