Nicole,

I talked to our weed control specialist, Michael Cunningham. His recommendation (below) is the same as what was circled in the "Cooperative Extension" attachment you sent me.

You mentioned on the phone that they intended to spray and cut 30 days later. Both the cooperative extension and Michael's recommendation is to spray and not touch it for 2 years to allow the chemicals to reach the root system. So what you are proposing is acceptable as long as you wait the 2 years instead of the 30 days.

To demonstrate they have been sprayed, you could send us a copy of their bill.

Tim,

If your Operator is proposing to use Arsenal for a foliar treatment, then they should wait 2 years before disturbing the tamarisk per BASFs recommendation. After 2 years when the cambium has turned brown, the vegetation should be burned or mulched. Off-site disposal at an appropriate location could also be an option. The same applies for the cut-stump treatment, mulch or burn vegetation afterwards. Let me know if you need anything else.
