This is in response to the Colorado Division of Wildlife project comment dated 6-8-2018.

TCVMD has observed the proposed permit area land several times a week for the past decade. The staff has been asked directly about the presence of any prairie dogs. I was told there are no prairie dog towns at the site. The District will conduct a last check, prior to earthmoving, for prairie dog towns and will conduct a burrowing owl survey if prairie dog towns are found within the proposed affected area.
