Hello Michael,

I am writing you to express my concerns of the gravel mine being proposed next to the town of Empire, CO. My property is adjacent to the site on the east side of the plateau that is to be excavated 200' down to the elevation of West Fork of Clear Creek.

I am opposed to this land being used as a quarry/gravel pit due to possible negative impact on ground and surface water flowing in and on my property and into West Fork of Clear Creek. I'm also concerned of the immediate and future impact on local wildlife, existing vegetation, and air quality due to dust generated from trucks and mining operation.

Don Baggus with the Division on Water Resources visited my property last month on June 7<sup>th</sup> and told me he forwarded his field observations to your office. I hope you have received those comments and can connect them to this letter and my attached observations.

Please see attachment that shows my property location and why I have concerns. I visually show why I'm worried that the mining operation will affect my property directly and negatively impact the entire county of Clear Creek.

Thank you for your time and taking my concerns into consideration when making your deciding on this project. I dropped off a hardcopy of this letter and attachment for you with Eilani at the front desk earlier today.



# Atchison property at 167 Junction Loop Road Empire, CO is downhill and


adjacent to east side of proposed mine and **IS OPPOSED to project due to:**

- 2. possible loss of existing vegetation & future erosion issues
- 3. effect on local wildlife habitat
- 4. air quality / dust since high winds are common






1) GROUND & SURFACE WATER CONCERNS for Atchison property at 167 Junction Loop Road Atchison property believes if gravel pit lowers plateau 200', water will no longer flow onto their property.



## 2) EXISTING VEGETATION CONCERNS for Atchison property at 167 Junction Loop Road

Atchison property believes if ground & surface water goes away so will site's lush vegetation. 1/4 of property remains wet year round & high water need plants such as Poplar varieties, Alder, Birch, Willow, fern, and moss varieties cover much of this area. Photos show how wet, green, & lush site is.

Atchison property believes gravel pit will disrupt Bighorn Sheep Herds habitats and range circulation






Figure 1. Distribution of bighorn sheep in the Georgetown herd





Figure 64. Aerial view of the US Highway 40 entrance ramp outo westbound Interstate 70. The orange circle indicates the area where highern sheep are stuck by vehicles.
