As land owner, Puckett Land Company, did not receive notice of a vehicle accident until late last week that a vehicle had lost control on I-70 near MP 72 and ended up in the I-70 ROW west of the frontage road. The incident caused the release of approximately 70-100 gallons of diesel fuel, of which a small portion came onto the referenced mine permit.

The incident was investigated by CDOT-HazMat response and as we understand has been reported to Colorado Department of Health. Under the direction of CDOT there currently is a clean-up being completed by CG Environmental, Denver office, of which we understand has the state-wide contract with CDOT.

We have required of the contractor we will need a certified report with soil samples ensuring that the clean-up is totally acceptable to the land owner. We will provide you with a copy once it is complete.
