OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety (Division). The Memphis Site is approved for 2.4 acres of affected land for the extraction of construction materials. Affected land will be reclaimed to support rangeland post mining land use. The Division currently holds a \$2,341.23 reclamtion financial warranty.

The mine identification sign was observed at the entrance to the mine site.

No mining related activity was observed during the inspection.

Overall the site was in good condition and no unnecessary debris or trash was observed during the inspection.

No erosion or sedimentation issues were noted. There are no major or minor drainage issues within the permit area that warrant addressing.

No problems or possible violations were observed during the inspection.
