Re: Holcim (US) Inc. – Boettcher Limestone Quarry Inspection Request for Extension

Ms. Eschberger,

Holcim is formally submitting this request for an extension on closing and implementing corrective actions to the two inspection topics cited in your report. Specific reasons for this requested extension are as follows:

Hydrologic Balance (Ponded Water)

Holcim has been work with the Colorado Division of Water Resources (DWR) to determine an exact amount for the replacement requirement. We have determined (and have received verbal agreement) that Holcim has a replacement requirement of up to 5 acre-feet per year of water from the ponds on the property. As such, Holcim has reached out to the City of Greeley to propose a water lease agreement that would satisfy DWR. Once the agreement if finalized, Holcim will submit an augmentation plan to DWR and request the Division sign off on the plan.

Greeley is still reviewing Holcim's proposal and has not yet officially responded. Depending on Greeley's final decision, Holcim will immediately move to finalize the lease OR we will have to seek an agreement with a different entity.

Hydrologic Balance (Groundwater Monitoring)

As you are aware, Holcim has been working with DRMS and WQCC to A) understand the groundwater monitoring parameters and requirements and to B) investigate opportunities for site-specific standards. This work has not been finalized, but we believe there may be a path forward that we will be proposing to the Division in the coming weeks.

Holcim hopes the Division is satisfied with the work that has been done to address these two issues thus far. We are, of course, continuing to work on both issues, but they are complex and involve both internal and external parties. I am happy to provide more information on these issues should you need it.
