Mr. Bynum:

Please be advised, on June 13, 2018, the five-year term of Temporary Cessation approved for Cash & Who Do Mines (Revision No. TC-2) expired, and the permit returned to Active status.

Rule 1.13.8(1) states that a permit granted pursuant to these Rules shall continue in effect as long as:

- (a) The mining operation is resumed within five (5) years of the beginning of Temporary Cessation; or
- (b) The operator files a request for an extension of the period of Temporary Cessation with the Board meeting the requirements of Rule 1.13.5(3) and secures Board approval of that request.
- (c) The operator is conducting reclamation pursuant to an approved reclamation plan or Board Order.

Rule 1.13.9 states:

In no case shall Temporary Cessation be continued for more than ten (10) years without terminating the mining operation and fully complying with the Reclamation and Environmental Protection Plan requirements of the Act and these Rules.
