## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety normal monitoring program. The Powderwash Pit No. 66 is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 30.85 permitted acres. It is located approximately 45 miles northeast of Craig and is accessed from Moffat County Road 66. Tim Dilldine and JD Hockday represented Moffat County and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The perimeter adjacent to mining zone No. 2 has recently been re-mowed/cleared just within the boundary. T-posts also mark the perimeter boundary.

This site has undergone significant changes since the last inspection. All of mining zone No. 1 has been regarded. Slopes are gentle and blend smoothly. Mining zone No. 1 will be seeded later this fall. Stormwater ditches were cleaned out and realigned where necessary. Mining zone No. 2 has been completely stripped. The overburden and topsoil piles from mining zone No. 1 remain in place. Material that was stripped from mining zone No. 2 was placed directly into mining zone No. 1 as to minimize material handling. This also helps to leave reclaimed stockpiles intact since they are already stable.

In mining zone No. 2 a dam was constructed along the northwestern edge adjacent to the gulch. The dam is approximately 10 feet tall be 75 feet long and collects runoff from all of mining zone No. 2. The dam was broadcast seeded. The previous weekend a significant rain even washed out culverts on nearby county roads. This resulted in a large amount of water being collected in the sediment pond from the recently stripped mining zone No. 2. The dam appeared to function properly with no excessive erosion or leaking out the back. All other stormwater ditches and berms also appeared to be functional.

During the inspection the county was working to set up the crusher so that they can begin processing material out of the next phase. A small amount of remaining material from mining zone No. 1 was scraped and transported to zone No. 2 prior to reclamation beginning. No other stockpiled material is on site.
