OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Mike Irwin, Ty Stultz and Bob Stamps, representing the Operator, were present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Lake County Gravel Pit is located approximately 1.8 miles southwest of Leadville and accessed from CR 23. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 55.97 permitted acres. Pursuant to Rule 4.1.2(2), no Financial Warranty is required for this site.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The active mine area is in the north portion of the permitted area. Mined slopes are maintained at near 3H:1V. Very little native topsoil exists at the site and importation of topsoil generated off-site is necessary in order for the Operator to comply with the approved Reclamation Plan, which requires topsoil to be distributed over the disturbed area to a depth of six inches. The Operator imports topsoil from outside sources in the vicinity, such as new road construction projects, when it is available. Topsoil is stockpiled on the west side of the active area, on the north side of the access road, and on the east side of the pit at the crest of the north pit slope.

An asphalt stockpile is located near the access road, on the south side of the disturbed area. Asphalt recycling at the site was approved through TR-1 in July 2011.

A crushing/screening facility is located in the pit floor. Fuel or other toxic chemicals are not stored on site.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
