OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety for permitted operations. The San Luis Project is a 112d-3 operation permitted for the extraction and milling of precious metals. Mining and milling activities were completed in 1996 and the site has been in varying degrees of final reclamation ever since. The site includes approximately 736.92 permitted acres, with approximately 332 affected acres that are currently undergoing reclamation. The affected areas are to be reclaimed to support various post-mining land uses including industrial/commercial, rangeland and wildlife habitat. The site is located approximately 4 miles northeast of San Luis, CO at approximately 8620 Feet in elevation. Public access to the site is controlled by a series of locked gates and the main offices and water treatment facility are located just north of Rito Seco Rd. The Division currently holds a \$7.4 Million Financial Warranty for the site. Six Photos accompany this report to illustrate the current site conditions.

The main focus of this inspection was to monitor the construction of the new concrete drop structure located adjacent to the tailings dam. All grading and earthwork for the drop structure has been completed and appears to be stable and in good condition. The anchor points along the structure as well as two sections of concrete have been formed and poured. Crews were in the process of setting and tying in the re-bar for the next two sections to be poured. The current progress of the structure can be seen in Photos One through Three. All conditions of the construction appear to be stable and in good condition and the progress appears to be progressing as designed.


Other areas of the permitted area were inspected for upcoming and ongoing reclamation tasks. Those areas include the water tower and facility, areas along the access road that can be reclaimed and storm water control structures located on site. The condition of the water tower area can be seen in Photos Four and Five. The remaining tasks that remain to be completed is, final cleanup and topsoil with revegetation.


