OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) normal monitoring program. The inspection was conducted by Amy Yeldell and Wally Erickson of the Division. Jessica Lopez Pearce of the Colorado River Valley Field Office BLM was also present during the inspection.

The Rifle Quarry is a 112c permitted site that consists of 1.65 acres. This site is in final reclamation.

Vegetation along the access road remains spotty. The ruts have very little vegetation. The center and shoulders of the road are growing well. This site would likely benefit from spot seeding measures along the road ruts.

Very little additional vegetation if any was present on the quarry floor as compared to the inspection in fall of 2017. The summer of 2018 was extremely hot and dry and was preceded by a mild and dry winter. Some grasses were observed however for the most part they were dried and scorched. Yarrow appeared to be the only plant that was thriving. Other small sage and rabbit brush plants were also observed though in far less abundance.

The south edge of the quarry which remains mostly in the shade was the exception where vegetation was thriving. The plants in the shade appeared to be doing well. There was a variety of grasses and forbs with adequate cover.

Hounds tongue, thistle and mullein were observed. There appeared to be no evidence of previous weed treatments. The Division cannot release areas where state listed noxious weeds area present. It is imperative that the operator employs noxious weed management techniques.
