

Dear Mr. Armentrout:

Thank you for your correspondence dated August 23, 2018 and received by our office on August 29, 2018 regarding the review of the above referenced project under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

After review of the documentation provided, we *concur* that the recommended effect finding of *no historic properties affected* [36 CFR 800.4(d)(1)] is appropriate for the proposed changes to the APE and design for Mountain Coal Company, LLC Sunset Trail Lease.

Should unidentified archaeological resources be discovered in the course of the project, work must be interrupted until the resources have been evaluated in terms of the National Register eligibility criteria (36 CFR 60.4) in consultation with our office pursuant to 36 CFR 800.13. Also, should the consulted-upon scope of the work change, please contact our office for continued consultation under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

We request being involved in the consultation process with the local government, which as stipulated in 36 CFR 800.3 is required to be notified of the undertaking, and with other consulting parties. Additional information provided by the local government or consulting parties might cause our office to re-evaluate our eligibility and potential effect findings. Please note that our compliance letter does not end the 30-day review period provided to other consulting parties.
