The proposed mine is known as the Robinson Sons Gravel Pit No. 1, and is located at or near Sections 26, Township 33 South, Range 67 West of the 6th Principal Meridian.

The proposed date of commencement is January 2019, and the proposed date of completion is, October 2041. The proposed future use of the land is pastureland and residential.
