GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS

OBSERVATIONS

The Andrews #3 (Mock Pit) was inspected by Peter Hays with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) in response to a final performance and financial warranty release request (SL-01) submitted by Lafarge West, Inc. on September 4, 2018. The Division is required by Rule 4.17.2 to inspect the site to determine if the Permittee has complied with all applicable requirements. The site was previously inspected by the Division on January 26, 2017. Mrs. Christine Felz with Lafarge North America Inc. was present during the inspection. No comments regarding the release request were received by the Division.

The Division will deny the final financial and performance warranty release request for the permitted area due to the lack of well-established vegetation at the site.

The site was permitted for 9.73 total acres. The site was divided into 2 pits; Pit #1 is 4.42 acres and Pit #2 was 4.13 acres. The access road accounts for the remaining 1.18 acres within the permit boundary. Pit #2 was release by the Division under an acreage reduction request on April 11, 2017.

The approved post-mining land use for the site is pastureland. Pit #1 is in final reclamation. The pit was regraded to remove the perimeter berm around the mining area, seed and mulched by Arnold's Custom Seeding (Arnold's) in the fall of 2016. The grading blended the pit disturbance into the existing site topography. No highwalls or steep slopes remain at the site. The access road will remain for the landowners use as approved in the Reclamation Plan.

The reclamation vegetation consisted of areas of little to no grasses and contained mostly Kochia. Evidence of drill row seeding and mulching were observed during the inspection. The south end of Pit #1 has self-reclaimed with well-established and diverse volunteer grass species. The Division recommends the reclamation area is reseeded with the approved seed mixture. The Operator stated the use of imprint seeding would be discussed with Arnold's to improve the reclamation success at the site.

The required mine sign was observed on the entrance gate and the site boundaries were delineated with tposts as required by Rule 3.1.12. The Division currently hold a financial warranty in the amount of \$8,117, which appears adequate to reclaim the site based on this inspection. No noxious weeds were observed during the inspection. The site was stable, no erosion features were observed during the inspection.
