RE: Hertzog Pit, File No. M-1981-276, Request for Reclamation Progress Update

Dear Mr. Bower:

The Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety (Division) last inspected the above mentioned site on May 7, 2018. In the attached inspection report it was noted that by the end of construction season (October 31, 2018) you would submit a technical revision (TR) to update the mining and reclamation plans based on the current operation. Specifically this TR would serve as a reclamation progress update and give all necessary figures in order to recalculate the reclamation cost estimate. The Division had previously delayed issuing a surety increase to allow you as the new operator time to complete reclamation tasks as a means of reducing the financial liability. See the Divisions attached April 4, 2018 letter regarding reclamation commitments.

Since this inspection the Division has not received an update beyond the annual report. The map that was included with the annual report does not depict the entire permit area or all of the affected lands. Furthermore information necessary to re-calculate the bond was not included. The Division request that you submit a TR to the mining and reclamation plan with updated maps depicting site conditions. Additionally provide the Division with the figures necessary to recalculate the reclamation cost estimate such as; maximum highwall length, height and slope, push distances of topsoil and volume, areas to be ripped and seeded, etc. Please submit a technical revision request by **Friday, December 14, 2018.**

If no technical revision is received by December 14, 2018 then the Division may issue a surety increase based on previous figures prior to progress made during the 2018 construction season.

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) as a follow up to reclamation commitments. These commitments were made by the previous operator then honored by the successive operator under the approval of SO-3. Bud Bower represented Bower Brothers Construction, Inc., and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection. The Hertzog Pit is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 77.4 permitted acres with a maximum disturbance of 15 acres. This site is located approximately four miles southeast of Maybell, Colorado. It is accessed from Moffat County Road 74.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The sign is located at the entrance to the permit boundary. The scale and scale house remain on site. A new scale house is being brought in and the old building will serve as storage. Both buildings are trailers and do not require a TR or affect the bond.

Significant reclamation progress has occurred since the last inspection. The majority of highwalls have been regarded. All highwall slopes on the western side (4.7 ac) have been contoured. Approximately two-thirds of the eastern portion (11.4 ac) has been contoured. The southeast portion (2.9 ac) remains the same as before. In additional the large gully in the northeastern corner of the pit that has been previously noted in inspections has been repaired. Mr. Bower is planning on also bringing in rock to help armor the channel to protect it from future erosion.

With regards to seeding only the southwestern portion (5.3 ac) has been seeded. The remainder of the western side of the pit will be seeded this fall. See attached map.

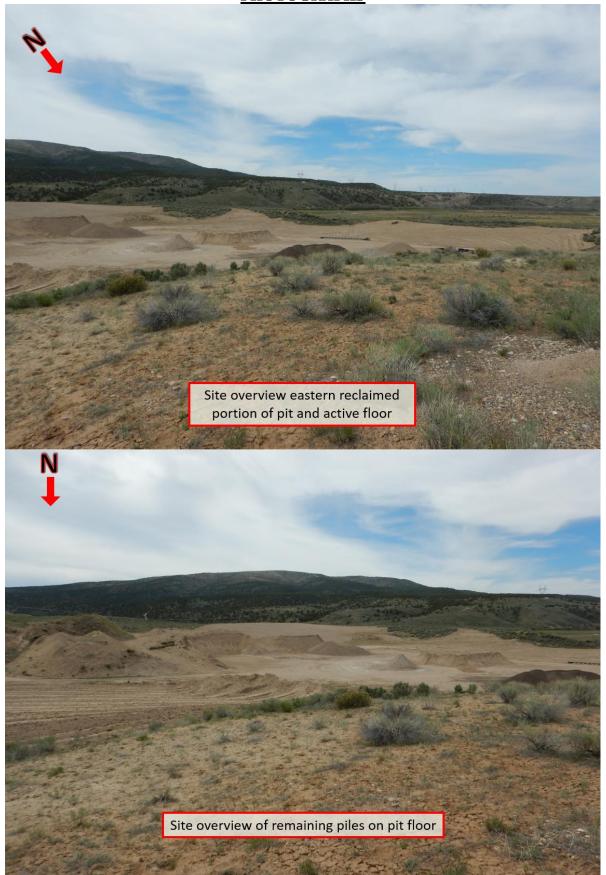
All fuel storage will be on the adjacent Taylor Pit (M-2013-006). A small equipment storage area is at the entrance of the excavated pit and neatly organized. A conveyor, dozer and skidster were on site. Stockpiles have been organized, consolidated and centralized, a few of the piles in the southeastern area still have additional work.

In lieu of recalculating the bond at this time the Division will allow the operator to continue with reclamation progress as a significant effort has been demonstrated. The Division requests that by the end of construction season (October 31, 2018) the operator submit a technical revision to update the mining and reclamation plans based on the current operation. This request should also include updated maps depicting the current 15 ac active area and previously reclaimed areas. This TR will serve as a reclamation progress update and give all necessary figures in order to recalculate the reclamation cost estimate. Please provide the Division misc. figures such as; maximum highwall length, height and slope, push distances of topsoil and volume, areas to be ripped and seeded, etc.

Currently the Division holds a financial warranty amount of \$36,650 for this site. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.



Dear Mr. Bower:

On November 9, 2017 the Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety (Division) approved your Succession of Operator for the above mentioned pit from RNP Enterprises. The previous operator had made reclamation commitments in lieu of a bond increase (attached). Given the timing of the SO the Division allowed extra time for reclamation activities to be completed before recalculating the bond. In the attached inspection report it was noted that the previous reclamation commitments would be completed by May 1, 2018. In the inspection report the Division also estimated that the bond after reducing the pit to 15 acres of disturbance would be approximately \$66,000.

The Division is writing you to remind you of these reclamation commitments that are due by <u>Tuesday May 1, 2018</u>. An inspection site will be scheduled on or soon after May 1, 2018. In addition a formal reclamation cost estimate will be done based on current site conditions and the approved reclamation plan.

Dear Mr. Taylor:

On December 6, 2016 the Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety (Division) received your commitment letter. In your letter you stated that:

- 1. All civil work (grading, ripping, and topsoil) must be completed by June 1, 2017.
- 2. All revegetation (seeding and mulching) must be completed by October 1, 2017.
- 3. The operator will notify the Division in writing when each of the above mentioned tasks have been completed so that an inspection may be scheduled to evaluate the work competed.
- 4. No additional disturbances will be made. Any mining activities will be contained within the existing footprint.

In phone conversations was mentioned that you may change your seed mix. Please make sure that you submit a technical revision and the \$216 revision fee at least 30 days before you wish to implement any changes to your reclamation plan. If in completing any of these reclamation tasks you have questions please do not hesitate to contact us.

The Division will inspect your site sometime after October 1, 2017. At that time we will evaluate reclamation progress made to date. The Division may at that time update the reclamation cost estimate which could result in a surety increase.

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OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) in response to the Succession of Operator (SO-3) application submitted on October 19, 2017. The current operator is RNP Enterprises, Inc. and the prospective operator is Bower Brothers Construction. Both the current operator Rusty Taylor and the prospective operator Bud Bower were present and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection. The Hertzog Pit is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 77.4 permitted acres. This site is located approximately four miles southeast of Maybell, Colorado. It is accessed from Moffat County Road 74.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The sign is located at the entrance to the permit boundary.

The site remains largely inactive. However ongoing reclamation efforts were observed. Currently the site is only permitted for a maximum disturbance of 15 acres. The south west corner, approximately 10 acres, has been topsoiled and reseeded. The northwest corner, approximately 3 acres, still has additional grading remaining. The prospective operator agreed to complete the previous commitment to reclamation the western portion as soon as he takes over the pit. The Division will allow additional time for these tasks to be completed. The remaining reclamation of the western portion must be completely reclaimed by May 1, 2018.

The eastern half of the pit remains unchanged. This is the area that will remain active and count towards the 15 acres of total maximum disturbance.

A small plant remains in place on the northwest corner of the pit. This will be removed upon approval of SO-3. It was not indicated if a new plant would be mobilized. The office and scale house will remain in place.

Currently the Division holds a financial warranty amount of \$36,650 for this site. Based on previous letters it was stated that the bond would be calculated after the fall 2017 reclamation inspection. The bond was anticipated to be approximately \$66k with the 15 acres of remaining disturbance. Due to the SO not all of the reclamation commitments have been met and approximately \$8k of additional work remains. A formal reclamation cost estimate update will be done in the May of 2018 based on the current conditions. This will allow the new permittee an opportunity to complete the reclamation commitments and reduce liabilities that may affect a potential increase.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
