OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). The Stone Pit is located approximately 6 miles south west of Cortez Colorado west of County Road 21. Pamela Leschak with the BLM Tres Rios Field Office was present during the inspection.

The Stone Pit is a 158.2 acre gravel pit with an approved post mine land use of rangeland. The operation was not active during the inspection. The site is in final reclamation and the remaining required reclamation task is seeding.

The purpose of the inspection was to observe the current conditions/progress of reclamation at the site. Staff was accompanied by the BLM to determine if the grading was complete. Both the BLM and Division staff agreed that the site's grading was complete and was ready for seeding.

The operator requested a surety reduction to reduce the reclamation liability to only account for seeding and weed control until adequate vegetation was established. The currently held financial warranty in the amount of \$17,232.00 is considered to be insufficient to cover the revegetation at this time and the surety reduction cannot be approved at this time. The operator was contacted via telephone and email explaining the cost of revegetation is greater than the currently held financial warranty with regard to the approved reclamation plan requirements. The operator was advised to submit a technical revision modifying the reclamation plan to incorporate the BLM recommend seed mix and omit some of the graveled staging areas and the access road from revegetation requirements. Once the technical revision is submitted and approved the site may be eligible for a surety reduction.

A tamarisk and Russian knapweed was observed within the disturbance area. The knapweed appeared to have been sprayed and the tamarisk will need to be removed in order to prevent a future infestation. This is not noted as a problem at this time but is documented to be used as a tool to monitor weed control efforts during future inspections.

No problems or violations were observed during the inspection.
