Thank you for your correspondence dated November 7, 2018 (received by our office on November 13, 2018) regarding the above subject project. A search of the Colorado cultural resource inventory database indicated one previously recorded site within the proposed project area:

Please understand too, that our files contain incomplete information for this area, as most of Colorado has not been inventoried for cultural resources. As a result, there is also the possibility that as yet unidentified cultural resources exist within the proposed project area.

As you may also know under federal law, our office takes on a formal consulting role on projects that have the potential to affect historic properties (such as buildings and archaeological sites). If this project includes Federal involvement (funding, permits and/or land), Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470) requires federal agencies to meet the requirements of as set forth in 36 CFR 800 ("Protection of Historic Properties") and the lead federal agency is legally responsible for all required findings and determinations of National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) eligibility and project effects (36 CFR 800.2(a) (3)). Under State Law, should human remains be discovered during project activities, the requirements under C.R.S. 24-80 (part 13) apply and must be followed.
