OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Jeff Hughes, representing the landowner/operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Cadgene Pit is located approximately two miles northwest of Redvale and accessed through a private drive off of 3500 Road. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 9.0 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$30,000.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

A mine identification sign was noted at the property entrance at 3500 Road. The sign includes the permit number, but not the name of the operation.

Reclamation work has occurred at the site since the Divisions last inspection. The highwall in the southwest part of the permit area has been partially reclaimed. Where regrading has occurred the slope has been reduced to 3H:1V or less steep. Some additional highwall reduction will be necessary on the south part of the slope. At the north end of the permit area, regrading has occurred and the perimeter berm has been graded and seeded.

The landowner expressed interest in retaining the existing materials stockpiles for use on the ranch property, and foregoing revegetation on the pit floor in order to leave a flat graveled surface for equipment storage related to ranch operations. This will need to be addressed through a technical revision to the permit, which will include a revised reclamation plan narrative and reclamation plan map.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
