OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Greg Frazier, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Vader Pit is located approximately four miles east of Gunnison and accessed from Hwy 50 at the east entrance or through the Sea Horse Ranch West Gravel Pit (M-2001-113) at the west entrance. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 35.3 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$58,500.00 for this site. The Division will review the reclamation costs in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan. The Operator will be notified under separate cover if the Division determines that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the east entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and roads that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The area south of Tomichi Creek is primarily used for stockpiling materials. Various materials stockpiles are located throughout this area.

Past mining in the area north of Tomichi Creek has created a pond. The banks of the pond are well vegetated and appear stable. The area immediately east of the pond was used in the past for stockpiling and/or processing. This area has not been reseeded or topsoiled yet as part of reclamation. Past inspections have noted significant noxious weed infestations in this area. Noxious weeds were not noted during this inspection and it appears the operator is taking measures necessary to control the noxious weeds.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
