Dear Mr. Doose:

On May 29, 2019, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety received your Limited Impact 110(1) Reclamation Permit Application package for the Von Doose Mine, File No. M-2019-031. Preliminary review of the information received determined that the additional information must be received before the Division can consider your application as being submitted and technical review can begin.

- 1. 6.3.1 Exhibit A- Legal Description and Location Map: Pursuant to Hard Rock and Metals Mining Rule 6.3.1 (3) the location map should include the names and property lines of all immediately adjacent surface owners of record. Please submit a new location map that has the property boundaries of the owners of the affected lands as well as the immediately adjacent surface owners. If this information renders the map illegible please feel free to use indicators that call out to a separate reference sheet.
- 2. <u>6.3.5 Exhibit E-Maps:</u> All maps that are submitted must be signed and dated by a registered land surveyor, professional engineer or qualified person pursuant to Hard Rock and Metals Mining Rule 6.2.1 (2)(b). Please submit a new set of all maps, including large and small copies that were submitted that have been signed and dated.

Your application will not be considered submitted until all the information listed above is received and found sufficient to begin our review. A decision date will be established 15 days from the date of receipt of all of the requested information.

You have **sixty (60) days** from the above date to submit all necessary documents that the Office needs for an application to be considered filed. The required materials should be received by the Division's Denver Office no later than Monday August 5, 2019. If, at the end of the sixty day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Office, the Office shall deny the application and terminate the application file.

This letter shall not be construed to mean that there are no other technical deficiencies in your application. The Division will review your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act after submittal of all required items.
