**Re: Incompleteness Notice, 111 Construction Materials New Permit Application
Brent Pit, Permit No. M-2019-032**

Mr. Bell:

On June 6, 2019, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received your 111 Construction Materials New Reclamation Permit package for the Brent Pit, Permit No. M-2019-032. Preliminary review of the information received determined that the following items must be received before the Division can consider your application as being submitted/filed and technical review can begin.

EXHIBIT A – Legal Description and Location Map (Rule 6.3.1):

1. An index map was not provided indicating sufficient information to determine the location of the affected land on the ground and existing and proposed roads of access routes to be used in connection with the mining operation. Please provide an index map that meets the requirements of Rule 6.3.1(3).

EXHIBIT G – Source of Legal Right-to-Enter (Rule 6.3.7):

2. The contract that was provided, while signed, does not have the month and day completed. Please provide a complete copy of the lease agreement.
3. While the next two items are not completeness items having them completed will reduce review time once the application is considered filed;
 - In the lease agreement the acreage is stated to be 20 acres where the application is for 19 acres. Please clarify this discrepancy.
 - The topsoil to be stripped in the lease agreement is listed to be 8-10 inches in depth, where in the application the depth of topsoil is listed to be 4-6 inches. Please clarify this discrepancy.

FINANCIAL WARRANTY:

4. A new 111 permit application requires a fully executed financial warranty of \$2,500 per acre. Please provide a fully executed financial warranty for enough money to cover the proposed 19 acre site.

Your 111 New Permit Application will not be considered submitted/filed until the information listed above is received and found sufficient to begin our review.



Pursuant to Rule 1.4.1(8), you have sixty (60) days from the date of this letter to submit all necessary documents that the Division needs for an application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Division, the Division may deny the application and terminate the application file. Should additional time be required to submit all the necessary documents an extension request can be submitted in writing for the Divisions consideration of extending the deadline.

The response to this Incompleteness Notice is due on or before August 9, 2019.

This letter shall not be interpreted to mean that there are no other completeness issues or technical deficiencies in your application. The Division will review your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act after submittal of all required items.
