## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety normal monitoring program. The Big Burn No. 17 is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 20 permitted acres. It is located approximately 85 miles northwest of Craig, CO and is accessed from Moffat County Road 10N. This site is on Bureau of Land Management (BLM) land however they were not notified prior to the inspection. Tim Dilldine represented Moffat County and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection.

The mine identification sign and affected area boundary markers are in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. There is a BLM access road that has been directed around the side of pit. The county has done additional work including moving rocks and use of berms to help direct traffic around the pit and protect its resources within the pit from public interaction. The road previously went through the middle of the pit. And a sign is posted near the entrance indicated which road is for pit access verse BLM access.

The site was inactive at the time of inspection but has recently had a large crushing operation earlier this year. All of the slopes in the newly mined area have been regraded to a 3H: 1V or less. The recently processed material is stockpiled neatly on the existing pit floor. No other reclamation has been completed to date. No erosion was observed. A sediment pond was observed, and it is well maintained. No structures, equipment or fuel were observed on site.

This pit is operated by a government entity therefore no bond is required. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
