OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Doug Wheeler, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The OWL White River Pit is located approximately eighteen miles west of Meeker and accessed from CR5. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 20.77 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$106,548.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts or fencing that was adequate to delineate the permit area boundary. There have been two acreage reductions to the permit area. The current permit area (20.77 acres) consists of the Phase 1 pit area (13.67 acres), the office, scale and parking area (1.43 acres), and the access road (5.67 acres).

Mining at the site is intermittent. Hauling was occurring during this inspection. The pit appears to be approximately 20 feet deep with the highwalls currently at approximately 2H:1V slopes. Several materials stockpiles are located on the pit floor. Topsoil is stockpiled in the southeast part of the pit. The topsoil stockpile appeared stable.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
