OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Steve Urie, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Urie Gravel Pit is located on the north side of Rangely and accessed from Rbc Road 46. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 30.48 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$91,600.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

The operator has performed reclamation work on the east end of the pit. Slopes have been graded to 2H:1V and revegetated. Mining of the pit is progressing to the west.

A processing and stockpile area is located to the west of the mined pit. Various materials stockpiles are located there.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
