The Division will expect either the conversion application (with the \$2,696 fee), a request for temporary cessation form (with the \$144 fee) or a notice that mining has been completed and final reclamation has begun on or before September 23, 2019.

Tim,

As you know we have been working with the El Paso County finalizing details for the expanding the Hale Pit. At the last minute they have come up with some requests for upgrading roads and collecting per ton fees for mined material. This came as a big surprise. We have a meeting with the County on Thursday the 22nd to try to resolve those issues.

The deadline for corrective action on the State was extended to 8/22 which I thought would be more than enough time to have the County permit solved. Things move very slowly with the County and here we are again.

Can you guys give us a little more time. These last issues are critical to our ability to mine the property.

The meeting is Thursday morning from 11 to 12. I can let you know Thursday afternoon how that meeting goes.
