OBSERVATIONS

The Thompson Resource aka Horn Gravel Pit was inspected by Peter Hays with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) in response to a citizen complaint (CT-02) received on August 7, 2019 from Ms. Raelyn Hoffman. The complaint letter was forwarded to the Operator on August 8, 2019. Mr. Ken Evans with Reclamation Ridge, LLC was notified of the inspection, however was not present during the inspection.

The complaint letter stated the Town of Granby said there is no current permit for the pit. The complainant is afraid the owner walked away and is going to leave the piles and mess behind. The complainant asked what is in place for this not to happen and who is responsible for it.

The site is an 112c operation permitted for 69.62 acres. The site was active during the inspection. Stockpiled material was being removed from the site by haul trucks. The Operator submitted a response to the complaint on August 12, 2019. The response stated the site is fully permitted and in compliance with the Division requirements and is bonded. The Division agrees with the Operator's statement. The site is considered active and in compliance by the Division. The Division holds a financial warranty in the amount of \$62,700.00. The warranty would be utilized by the Division to reclaim the site in accordance with the approved reclamation plan if the Operator failed to complete reclamation of the site. The Operator stated they are currently in the process of renewing the CUP with the Town of Granby. The permit renewal appears to be why the complainant was told by the Town of Granby there is no permit for the pit. The complaint is considered resolved by the Division.
