Sealing of the underground mine openings was performed in accordance with the approved plan. The sediment pond was backfilled and vegetated in late 2015. A phase I bond release was approved on October 19, 1995 and a phase II bond release was approved on August 17, 2001.

Vegetation studies performed in 2018 and 2019 have shown that the target reclaimed plant communities meet Phase III Bond Release success criteria and satisfy CB Minerals Company's approved reclamation plan. Ground cover and production of perennial plants within the reclaimed areas are comparable to adjacent undisturbed native communities and plant succession is progressing in a positive direction, indicating that plants are self-sustaining.

### Supplemental Information

### **Groundwater Monitoring**

In its proposed decision and findings of compliance for permit renewal No. 7, the Division found that groundwater monitoring was no longer necessary. This finding was based on the facts that the mine never produced coal, the portal entries did not encounter groundwater, and monitoring from 1984 to 1994 indicated the limited development work prior to reclamation had not impacted groundwater quality or quantity.

#### Surface Water Monitoring

The CDPS permit requires that at least two comprehensive inspections are conducted each year, once in the spring and once in the fall. At a minimum one of the two inspections must be conducted during a run-off event. The permit also requires the permitee to conduct corrective actions across the facility for deficiencies represented by each DRMS inspection. The required yearly comprehensive inspections have been conducted in accordance with the CDPS permit. No discharge has occurred and no erosion of the reclaimed area has been noted. No deficiencies have been listed in the DRMS inspection reports.

### Subsidence

A subsidence control plan was developed for the operation (see permit application pages 4-87 through 4-91). Because operations were idled before production began, no subsidence monitoring was initiated.

### Post Mining Land Use

The Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine is compatible with Garfield County Zoning regulation of Agriculture/PUD. The approved post-mining land use is dry land pasture and wildlife habitat (Figure 4.7-2).

The 2018 and 2019 vegetation reports indicate the ground cover of perennial plants within the reclaimed areas are comparable to adjacent undisturbed native communities and plant succession is occurring and progressing in a positive direction, indicating that plants are self sustaining. This demonstrates the success and utility of the vegetated areas to be used for the approved post mining land use of dry land pasture and wildlife habitat.

CB Minerals Company, LLC is responsible for the Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine under Division of Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety, Permit No. C-1984-065. Mine site reclamation commenced in early May 1994 and demolition, portal sealing, backfilling, grading and seeding were complete by the end of August 1994. The sediment pond was backfilled, graded and seeded during October and November 2015.

One provision of the Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety's Rules is that the mine must be bonded for the estimated reclamation cost. The Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety released a portion of the bond in 1995 after backfilling and grading of the site was complete. Additional bond was released after vegetation was established. CB Minerals Company, LLC has formerly requested a Phase III bond release from the Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety. CB Minerals Company, LLC has a bond liability of \$43,200 and has requested that the entire amount be released. In accordance with the Division's Rule 3.03.2(1), CB Minerals Company, LLC is required to send written notice of its full and final bond release request to adjacent land owners, surface owners and various local governing bodies.

The area for which final bond release is being requested is at the Coal Ridge No. 1 Mine which is located approximately 3 miles east of New Castle, south of the Colorado River in the Grand Hogback region in Garfield County.
