OBSERVATIONS

The Henderson Mill was scheduled to be inspected by Peter Hays and Amy Eschberger with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) as part of the Division's monitoring inspection program on March 26, 2020. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Polis issued an executive order with travel restrictions for state employees. Therefore, the Division is unable to perform the inspection at this time.

The Division was prepared to inspect the designated chemical storage facilities at the Mill facility. The current Environmental Protection Plan (EPP), which includes details regarding the storage of designated chemicals at the Mill was approved by the Division under TR-08 on November 2, 2012. Henderson is in the process of revising the EPP to update the plan.

The inspection of the designated chemical storage facilities at the Mill will be rescheduled once the travel ban is lifted by the Governor.
