Hello Tim,

We had some more concern from a City Councilman and other citizens regarding Langston. I talk to him and visited the area with issues and now fully understand his concerns. The problem area is quite a bit north of the exiting permitted area. Apparently it looks like they've opened up a vein of gravel that may or is permitted in a different permit and then bring the material back to their original site to process. We didn't see any posted permit or any other information at the entrance to the site and while it looks like it used to operate as a gravel area, it looks like it's been dormant for quite some time. We would assume there would be some type of process to reopen the area. Also, there is quite a bit of road damage to county and especially city roads that I've circled on the map. The complaint is that they are using the pandemic as an opportunity to conduct mining activities that don't meet their approved permits. This northern area may be permitted so I thought I would reach out to you to see if there is a file on that property.
