Dear M. Binns:

We received correspondence dated April 30, 2020 on May 05, 2020 initiating consultation with our office pursuant to the Colorado State Register Act - Colorado Revised Statute (CRS) 24-80.1 - as amended.

After review of the documentation provided, we note that this technical revision proposes a limestone inlet on the pond 013 and surface water baffles. We understand that this proposed revision does not incorporate additional lands, or additional surface disturbance areas outside of the currently approved disturbance area, this Technical Revision (TR-99) will have *no adverse effect* to historic properties listed to or eligible for listing to the State Register.

If the proposed mining plan revision involves Federal oversight please note that it is the responsibility of the Federal agencies involved to comply with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act as set forth in 36 CFR Part 800 ("Protection of Historic Properties"). This includes the identification of any historic properties within the area of potential effects and determining whether the undertaking will have an effect upon such properties. The State Historic Preservation Office, Native American tribes, representatives of local governments, and applicants for Federal permits, licenses or other approval are entitled to consultative roles in this process
