The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received your Notice of Intent to Conduct Prospecting Operations for Hard Rock/ Metal Mines on May 26, 2020. Preliminary review of the information received indicated that all items required under Rule 5.1.2 were satisfied, therefore your application can not be considered complete and filed. The following information must be submitted:

1. **Legal Right to Enter:** Pursuant to Rule 5.1.2 (d)(vi) the Applicant must provide a description of lands, including: provide documentation of the legal right to enter to conduct prospecting and reclamation, for Owners of Record described in Rule 1.6.2(1)(e)(i). this may include a copy of a lease, deed, abstract of title, a current tax receipt, or a signed statement by the Landowner(s) and acknowledged by a Notary Public stating that the Prospector has legal right to enter to conduct prospecting and reclamation.

Your application will not be considered submitted until the above listed information and found sufficient to begin our technical review. All required information must be received by the Divisions Denver Office within **Sixty (60) days** from the date of this letter for the application to be considered complete and filed. Completeness must be achieved by no later than **Friday July 31, 2020**. This letter shall not be construed to mean that there are no other technical deficiencies in your application.
