Dear Ms. Eschberger:

On behalf of the operator, Central City Consolidated Mining Co. ("CCCM"), we are pleased to provide you with the following update regarding the Golden Gilpin mill, operated under DRMS permit M1990-01.

On June 10, 2020, the City of Black Hawk approved the Special Review Use of the Golden Gilpin Mill for mining/milling (and tourism) uses. Under the City's most recent land use code updates, the Golden Gilpin Mill is zoned as "ECP – Environmental Character Preservation" which is the only zoning that allows for mining and milling (mineral processing). The mining and milling use of this property required "Special Review Use" application and approval which was granted by this resolution.

We have already abated the issues under the MLRB Order of September 27, 2017, specifically bonding and reclamation for this site, via additional bonding provided and Technical Revision (TR04) approval. One other condition of that Order discussed the need for CCCM to obtain a Special Review Use approval from the City of Black Hawk. With the City's resolution of June 10, 2020, that has also been accomplished, although it was not an outstanding issue.

Current activity at the site includes laboratory analysis of Bates-Hunter materials and rehabilitation of the existing buildings and equipment. The owner of the Golden Gilpin Mill, the George E. Otten, Jr. Estate, will continue to develop the property into a fully functioning mineral processing facility as permitted under M1990-041. We do anticipate a final site grading to cap the historic tailings and the construction of a modern tailings dewatering facility. As already stated in the approved reclamation plan for the site "All buildings and structures shall remain". With the local permitting process successfully underway for building and site improvement (development), we anticipate no further complications from this site regarding the final reclamation or permitting.

Resolution No. 45-2020

TITLE: A RESOLUTION CONDITIONALLY APPROVING THE SPECIAL REVIEW USE PERMIT FOR THE GOLDEN GILPIN MILL

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK HAWK, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves a Special Review Use Permit for the Golden Gilpin Mill located at 7593 State Highway 119, subject to the following conditions:

A. Approval of a minor subdivision plat is required prior to construction of any structures on the property, including Mill Site #10 and Mill Site #11;

B. A Certificate of Architectural Compatibility (COAC) is required prior to construction of any new structures, modification of the exterior of any existing structures, or any other site improvements;

C. Approval of a Site Development Plan (SDP) is required prior to commencement of any construction of new buildings associated with the mining/milling activities. The SDP must address, at a minimum, site distance triangle issues and access along State Highway 119, bridge rating, finished floor elevations in relation to the 100-year floodplain, and all other requirements outlined in Sec. 16-362. - Site development standards of the Black Hawk Municipal Code;

D. The Special Review Use permit is valid for operation between the Golden Gilpin Mill, and further authorizes the acceptance of minerals from the Bates-Hunter mine. Acceptance of minerals from other mines other than the Bates-Hunter Mine will require an amendment to this permit;

E. Confirmation from the applicant that there is no injury to others' water rights for water from North Clear Creek;

F. State regulated sound levels will need to be adhered to at all times and need to be monitored and mitigation techniques will need to be implemented if necessary;

G. No waters, chemicals, or other spoils from the milling operations will be allowed to enter the sanitary sewer system; and

H. All relevant building permits and public works permits are required prior to any site improvements or construction of same either before or after a Site Development Plan is approved and are the responsibility of the applicant.

Section 2. The Special Review Use Permit shall be effective for the term set forth in Section 16-363, subsection (c)(2). No specific term is otherwise provided by this approval.
