Dear Mr. Moline:

I have started reviewing the 2019 ARR, and I have one primary question at this time. Once this question is answered, I think the rest of my review will go smoothly.

What is included in your value for total acres disturbed? (This is 442.88 acres in your ARR form.) It would be helpful to provide a map, or even multiple maps, if appropriate. You can refer me to a map (or maps) from the PAP or past ARRs.

The total acres disturbed should include all of the historical disturbance, including areas that have been Phase III released. It should also include all long-term facilities that have historically been in the permit boundary, such as the entrance road. Per archived versions of Appendix A-1, the entire road (nearly all the way to I76) was in the permit boundary in the past.
