NOTICE OF PROPOSED DECISION

The Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety proposes to approve Technical Revision Application No. 98 (TR-98) for the New Horizon Mine (Permit No. C-1981-008), submitted by Elk Ridge Mining and Reclamation, LLC. TR-98 proposes to reduce the permit boundary to remove Phase III released lands.

The New Horizon Mine is a surface coal mine located in Montrose County, approximately 1.7 miles NW of Nucha, Colorado. Coal interest is private, and the surface affected is private land. The permit area encompasses approximately 535.65 acres.

This proposed decision is based on a finding that the proposed operation will comply with all requirements of the Colorado Surface Coal Mining Reclamation Act, Section 34-3-101, et seq., C.R.S., and the regulations promulgated thereunder.
