Dear Mr. Zaruba:

On July 6, 2020, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety received your 112c Construction Materials Reclamation Permit Amendment application for the Eagle-Gypsum Mine, which is located in Eagle County. Preliminary review of the information received determined that the additional information must be received before the Division can consider your application complete and technical review can begin. Thus, your application is incomplete for the purposes of filing as of July 17, 2020.

- The reason for the determination of an incomplete application is that American Gypsum Company LLC submitted the BLM POO and did not send in a complete application with the requirements and exhibits in Rule 6.4. Please refer to the entire Rule 6.4 to develop your application in regards to the Specific Exhibit Requirements – 112 Reclamation Operation.

You have sixty (60) days from July 17, 2020 to submit all necessary documents that the Division needs for the application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty day period, the application has not been determined to be complete and filed, the Division will deny the application and terminate the application file.

This letter shall not be construed to mean that there are no other technical deficiencies in your application. The Division will review your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act after submittal of all required items.
