RE: In the Matter of Colorado Stone Quarries, Inc., Permit No. M-1999-058, 2020 Annual Report

Mr. Czapla:

Please find the attached 2020 Annual Report Map for the Pride of America Mine operated by Colorado Stone Quarries in Marble, Colorado. Daniel Penfield, CSQ Safety Manager, will submit their 2020 Annual Report and pay the filing fee via the DRMS ePermitting portal.

As of August 19, 2020, the affected area will include 27.5 acres of disturbance. The increase in affected acreage is due to activities detailed in Technical Revision 5, approved by the DRMS October 11, 2018, coupled with initiation of the mining access road to the Jefferson Quarry and mining of the Franklin Quarry. Additional disturbance was required during the immediate clean-up efforts from the October 2019 fuel spill as detailed in the *October 11th, 2019 Diesel Spill Report*, dated November 27, 2019 as filed with the Division.

2019-2020 activities included: slope remediation, fortification of the northern sump and clean-up associated with the October 2019 fuel spill, Franklin Quarry mining, Hamilton Gallery mining, Lincoln Gallery mining, maintenance and installation of flow attenuators in the eastern channel of Yule Creek, construction of the Jefferson Quarry access road, construction and safety barrier installation of the Yule Creek Trail as dictated by Gunnison County, installation of groundwater monitoring wells, and installation of a HDPE liner beneath the main fueling area and generator conex.

Affected acreage for the 2019-2020 Annual Report details a change of 5.4 acres and was the result of immediate clean-up activities related to the October 2019 fuel spill, initiated mining of the Franklin Quarry, and construction of the Jefferson Quarry access road. The upper Washington dump was hydroseeded in 2018 and shows strong signs of successful revegetation; therefore, 0.35 acres were reclaimed in the past year. The lower Washington dump (1.0 acre) and

the blasted area above the Franklin dump (1.0 acre) will be hydroseeded and reclaimed in the coming year.

Additionally, as detailed in TR-06, CSQ is submitting their monthly water sampling data as an attachment to the report.
