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## **Preamble**

Pursuant to notification from the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety, dated August 12, 2020 (Minerals Program Inspection Report), detailing information in Colorado Milling Company's ("CMC") Minerals Reclamation Permit Annual Report, dated July 26, 2020, that has been deemed "inaccurate or incomplete", the following addendum has been prepared.

The requested corrective actions, including updated and accurate information for the items identified in the inspection report are provided on the following pages, in the order that they were raised in the report.

#### Addendum Items

#### *1. Item* # *4*

The CMC report answered "No" to this question, an answer that has been deemed as inaccurate. This item refers to "excavation, processing or hauling" in its definition of "activity", as seen in the online annual report form. CMC has not initiated any excavation, processing or hauling activities, so in this respect the answer is accurate. The only activities to have taken place in the permit area during the period from July 2019 – July 2020, aside from compulsory water monitoring and general property security and maintenance, has included engineering audits of CMC's mill facility and water infrastructure carried out by independent engineering firms, each consisting of one-day visits to the permit area; and second, a total of 9 samples of material from the mine dump lying adjacent to the mill, taken for mineralogical analysis to determine their gold and silver contents. In this context, CMC's answer is "yes".

#### 2. *Item* #6

Apparently, the meaning of the question in this item was misunderstood and thus incorrectly answered. As recorded in the aforementioned inspection report, the Division realizes that this question is worded in a way that could be misinterpreted. CMC's correct answer is "no", the mine has not been granted approval of a Temporary Cessation status.

This item was incorrectly answered. The correct answer is "yes".
