The 031220 SO Authorized Letter, attached in the below email gives Mr. Lovett right of entry as the Plan of Operations and all reclamation requirements were transferred to him upon the approval of the SO.

BLM does not require an entirely new copy of the Plan of Operations when a SO is received. As long as the SO request contains the new operator's information and is deemed complete then the Plan and reclamation requirements are entirely transferred to the new operator.

Dear Mr. Lovett,

BLM received a Succession of Operators application on March 03, 2020 for the El Rancho Bondo mining operations located in Township 18 South, Range 71 West, Section 18 in Fremont County, CO. BLM has reviewed the Succession of Operator and found it complete, following a review of the application and receiving the required financial requirement of \$2,219, per 43 CFR 3809.551 regs.

According to our records, the Plan of Operations submitted for mining activities at this location was initially analyzed under the Environmental Assessment (EA) number DOI-BLM-CO-F02-2014-0001-EA and authorized by BLM on July 09, 2015. A modification to the Plan of Operations to include dredging operations, was analyzed under DOI-BLM-CO-F020-2018-0041-EA and authorized on November 20, 2019.

BLM last inspected the above operations on March 03, 2020. Once your reclamation bond is posted and the current bond is released to Thomas Zimmerman, a baseline inspection will be conducted to document all mining related disturbance and any interim reclamation.

As the new operator, you are obligated to coordinate with the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (CDRMS) and any other Federal, State or county agencies regarding the appropriate paperwork required to transfer any mining related bonds, permits, easements, leases, etc.
