I am writing to voice my opposition to the proposed Peak Materials 80 acre gravel pit. We live in Summit County and witness the constant traffic backups at the Silverthorne and I70 intersection. The County and CDOT has been studying this problem for some time now. We do need an additional several hundred trucks hauling heavy materials added to this stretch of road. Additional mining operations in this area will also adversely impact the Blue River harming an already fragile ecosystem. It would most likely also deplete and contaminate local well water. Peak materials is behind on reclamation and now wants to expand which is totally unacceptable.

We do not need another gravel pit in Summit County destroying the Blue river ecosystem and ruining Highway 9 between the requested location and Interstate 70.

I strongly recommend you deny this request.
