I'm writing in response to Peak Material's application to develop the Peak Ranch Resource Site, four miles north of their processing plant at Maryland Creek Ranch in Summit County, Colorado. It is estimated that the proposed development would add an additional 230 trucks per day along this four mile section of Highway 9. As a local and national cyclist I am concerned about the increased truck traffic of this proposed development and it's associated increase in roadside debris. On a recent group ride the current truck debris caused one rider to lose control and become injured. The proposed development, the permit should require Peak Materials to undertake the extension of the existing Summit County recreation path to the north of the proposed development. The extension of the separate recreational path would result in safer travel for both cyclists and Peak Material trucks.
