This letter is in protest of the Peak Ranch Resource petition File # M2026041. I live in Acorn Creek, and was happy the Lower Blue Master Planning group is either planning to, or did already vote against this petition.

I am writing this as I am aggrieved by this proposed project for the following reasons:

o My water well water quantity and/or quality will be greatly harmed

 $_{\odot}$ Wildlife (including the Blue River fishery), will be severely and negatively affected

o Peak's reclamation plan is inadequate

 Even though DRMS is not required to address highway safety, that 230 oneway gravel truck trips a day for 8 months a year back and forth to Maryland Creek for processing, creates a safety hazard for humans and wildlife, potential for vehicles to collide with wildlife, bikers to get run over by gravel trucks, and gravel trucks to collide with cars entering and exiting the various subdivisions between the proposed mine and Maryland Creek.

So I fervently hope you will deny this egregious request for approval.
